

Dear friends

According to retired Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby "There has never been a renewal of the Church in Western Europe without a renewal of prayer and the life of religious communities. If we want to see things changed, it starts with prayer."

He said this when he invited members of the Chemin Neuf community to come and live at Lambeth Palace. This community is interdenominational and international. The community prays daily at Lambeth for divisions between churches to be healed, and its presence there was as a sign of the Archbishop's commitment to unity among Christians. This is the prayer which they pray daily there and invite others all over the world to join with them in praying

Lord Jesus, who prayed that we might all be one, we pray to you for the unity of Christians, according to your will, according to your means.

May your Spirit enable us to experience the suffering caused by division, to see our sin and to hope beyond all hope. Amen.

One of the things which came up at our vestry retreat was the need for prayer. Beginning in November on the last Wednesday of the month after the midweek service (& the cuppa) at St Peter's there will be a prayer meeting. We'll be praying for our church, our community and our world. I hope that as many of you as possible will join us.

Each week in the Angle there are prayers so that we are praying for the global church (the global Anglican Communion

puts out a prayer guide which covers 3 years with a different country or diocese to be prayed for every day). The NZ Anglican board of missions and the Waiapu diocese each put out a monthly prayer cycle with different prayers for each day of a 31-day month. And we also list prayer requests from parishioners. I hope this helps us keep a wide

requests from parishioners. I hope this helps us keep a wide angle in our intercessory prayers.

This week's gospel is about the importance of prayer. The parable is not telling us that God is like the mean judge. The point is to remind us to make prayer a priority and to persist in prayer. Prayer is one of the ways we participate in the mission of God. Prayer is something we can do together as well as alone.

Prayer is so often not about changing God but about us being changed as we pray. This prayer by Colin Gibson expresses that:

"Holy and compassionate God, may your bright Spirit Lead us in the dance of joyful love, restore us to community,

Challenge us to campaign for peace with justice, Enable us to live graciously, compassionately and lovingly.

Lord, help us make the bitter, savage world out there a place where people dare to reach out once more to each other.

Christ help us to open the clenched fist and the closed mind.

To justice and compassion we commit ourselves.

To the care and nurture of the earth we commit ourselves.

To work out your love and your purpose we commit ourselves. Amen."
