

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Dear friends

The Trinity didn't begin with doctrine; it didn't begin with theologians. The Trinity is based on scripture and experience. Scripture clearly teaches that God is one, yet humans encountered God in the person of Christ, and God in the presence of the Spirit. The scriptures also give us a view of a complex God who has a "more-than-oneness". The theologians merely put words to what we knew from scripture and experience.

In the creation story we discover this relational God of the Trinity. God created not one kind of human, but diverse humans in relationship; male and female, to reflect God who is also a relational God, a God of love-in-community. God was not an old white man in the sky, God was the original they/them — not gendered, and not individual. In God there is unity in diversity, and we are created to reflect God — to reflect unity in diversity in our communities of love.

Richard of St Victor in the 12th century argued that if God were just one person, God could not be intrinsically loving, since for all eternity (before creation) God would have had nobody to love... Being perfectly loving, from all eternity the Father and the Son have delighted to share their love and joy with and through the Spirit. It is not, then that God starts

sharing; being triune, God is a sharing God, a God who loves to include. Indeed, that is why God will go on to create. His love is not for keeping but for spreading.

Yahweh was known as a God rich in mercy and faithful love. The incarnation of Christ the Word made that love even more visible; Jesus embodied the grace of God. The Holy Spirit, present in the world, present in the church, present in us, invites our participation in the communion of the Triune God and with each other.

One ancient understanding of the Trinity is - there is the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit is the Love they share. It is this love personified which was shared with the church at pentecost and inhabits the church today. The gift of the Holy Spirit was an invitation for us to participate in and experience the love within the Godhead - Wow!

We live in a world characterised by increasing loneliness, the Trinity is about loving communion. Our world is fractured and divided into "us and them" – the Trinity celebrates unity in diversity. The trinity "dance," in which each makes room for the other, is so needed in this world.

Hildegarde of Bingen

She was an extraordinary woman, centuries ahead of her time. If you get an opportunity to read a biography about her, read some of her writings, or listen to more of her music – take it! Here is a brief note about her from For all the Saints.

Hildegarde of Bingen was born in 1098 and became abbess of a Benedictine women's community. She was remarkably gifted in many fields: abbess, prophet, theologian and reformer, composer, artist and scientist. In her lifetime she was famed as a healer and spiritual counsellor. Later generations revered her fiery apocalyptic preaching. Today many find attractive her gift of holistic vision and her unflinching quest for justice. She died in 1179.

Prayers of the People:


Today we pray for the Anglican Church of Mexico and we pray for the women in New Zealand and from our Church who provide continuing support for overseas mission.
